#### Pastoral Reflections

April showers bring May flowers... Well with the amount of rain we have had lately and the warmer than normal temperatures, we should be having a whole lot of beautiful flowers.

This got me thinking of flowers and the different types of flowers. I thought about the beautiful flowers that cover for something different below the surface. There are the flowers that are beautiful but also are poisonous or have thorns below.

May has been designated as Mental Health Awareness month. Some congregations choose to become WISE congregations. (A WISE congregation has joined the mission to being Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged in the Mental Health of the community and the wider world.)

I believe based on anecdotal evidence that people with significant mental health issues has increased following the pandemic. Social isolation and fear have brought about an uneasiness and questioning of previously assumed foundations of our lives and society as a whole. This combined with an increasing self-actualizing lifestyle have left many to see themselves as the masters of their own universe and meaning of life. The foundation of a higher power has become less of an influence in our lives.

Unfortunately, like the flower I described above, we may see many of those who we come in contact with as being all together and with no problems or significant cares in the world. Fortunately, we have seen an increased awareness of mental health and the acceptance of getting treatment in whatever form that takes.

Maybe we should consider becoming a "WISE" congregation?

"Since one in four individuals lives with a diagnosable mental health condition, it's safe to say that individuals in our congregation are dealing with any variety of mental health and substance use challenges every day. Due to stigma, many of these people may be reluctant to either seek help professionally or speak about it with their pastor or other members of their church. However, an atmosphere of openness and acceptance in a congregation makes members, friends, and visitors more likely to feel safe and free from judgment. This acceptance and sense of safety can help create a place of belonging, where truly everyone, no matter where they are on life's journey, is welcome. "— UCC's WISE Congregation for Mental Health Toolkit






