Pastoral Reflections

This past month, following the Memorial Day observance, I drove up to the Old Roxbury town center. For those who are unfamiliar with this location, it is at the end of Lower County Road where it meets Old Roxbury Road



coming up the hill from Rt 67. There is where the first and second meetinghouses of our Church as well as the first building of the Christ Episcopal Church. The buildings were located in the corner of the current cemetery there. Probably would be better to describe it as the cemetery surrounded the meetinghouse.

Walking around in this cemetery, we can see the faded headstones of our first minister, Rev'd Thomas Canfield who served right out of Yale Seminary from 1743 until his death at 75 in 1795. Yes, that is 52 years as their minister! I know many of you kid me that I am the longest serving minister, but let me assure you that I will not even come close!

One story that is important to come away with from a cemetery walk about is that the church has been dealing with change for years here in Roxbury. In 1796, the church moved it's location to a new "center" of town down in the valley where we are located now. (Also interesting is that this happened the year after the Rev'd Canfield died.)

While I am not suggesting that we should look at moving the church building, we need to be open where we need to be moving as far as our mission and ministry.

It is no surprise that people are flocking to the meetinghouse for a Sunday worship service. If we are to be about the work that Christ calls us, we will need to hit the road and bring that message to others.

I am grateful for Thomas Canfield's ministry and what those early pilgrims did to share the faith and remain flexible and nimble in the cause of Christ.





Types of Planned Gifts

Gifts through your will

The Roxbury Congregational Church can be named as a beneficiary in your will and you can specify an outright gift of cash, securities, real estate of tangible personal property. If you estate is subject to the federal estate tax, a charitable bequest can save significant tax dollars. Gifts made to the church <u>for a specific purpose</u> must be agreed upon <u>beforehand</u> by the Board of Trustees.

Appreciated Stock

By making a gift of stock you receive an income tax deduction and eliminate the capital gains tax.

Charitable Remainder Trust

You can use under-performing appreciated assets to create steady income for the rest of your life. You receive a significant charitable deduction and the capital gains tax is eliminated. Your trust can be professionally managed.

Note: Undesignated Bequests are, by policy, split 10% for mission projects with the remainder split 50/50 between the Church's Investment Account, with growth and interest only being used, and the Capital Reserve Fund, used for capital improvements and ministry opportunities. Recently, monies from the Peck bequest were used for 2 cameras for virtual worship and for incidentals for the new generator.

Litchfield South Association

of the United Church of Christ

Our Church is a member of this Association of 16 local UCC congregations and clergy in southern Litchfield County. They meet as a large gathering of delegates each May and October in one of the churches for a meal

and a program of interest to the churches. The Church and Ministry Committee meets on a monthly basis and is in charge of oversight of clergy and congregations particular around ethics as well as the shepherding of those who wish to become ordained clergy.
