## *Pastoral Reflections*     Rev. David Peters

It never ceases to amaze me the many expressions of community that the Roxbury Church is involved in. In smaller towns, a church can be vital to the health and wellbeing of a community. Take our church for example. Besides the normal, expected roles of providing worship opportunities, support for its members during life cycle events of birth, nurture of children and young people, marriage, aging and at the time of dying and death, the Roxbury Church seeks to be involved in many other ways.

The Roxbury Church seeks to be seen and experienced more than a historic building with people to attend to carry on a religious rite based in a book written over thousands of years. We seek to make the whole community better. We provide and promote activities that bring people together and share with food, conversation, and healthy, fun competition. As members of the congregation and as clergy, we provide leadership to town boards, committees, and organizations hopefully demonstrating the spirit and vision that we speak of at the church.

We also go beyond by learning about and taking action on those things that stretch, expand and enrich our town and region. Our latest programs

around mental health awareness and environmental awareness and action are included in this. We also are the Church while we share our concerns around feeding the needy in our town and region, when we work to ensure affordable housing is available for those who are downsizing or our young families seeking to move back to the community when housing is scarce or unaffordable or not right-sized.

We are the church when we have as a policy that we don't just grant money as an expression of our Christian mission, but seek to also learn about mission partners, have a real relationship with them including them to be present in the flesh among us.

We are the church when we pause and reflect how we can best share God's love in our community in changing times. Old models, once relevant are now not as effective. What can be held on to and what should be let go. As Christian thinker, Phyllis Tickle put it, "the church must undergo a great rummage sale. We must go through the house and seek what we want to keep and what should be given away."

I celebrate our church and I hope do too. I am proud of who we are and the spirit of adventure and experimentation that you are bring to the church. May we continue in the years to come.

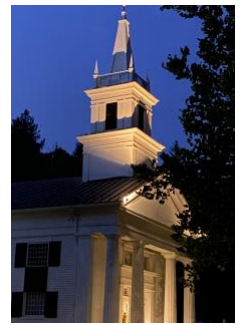

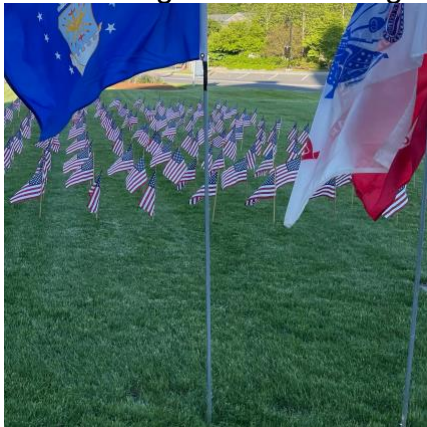

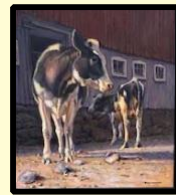

### Types of Planned Gifts

#### Gifts through your will

The Roxbury Congregational Church can be named as a beneficiary in your will and you can specify an outright gift of cash, securities, real estate of tangible personal property. If your estate is subject to the federal estate tax, a charitable bequest can save significant tax dollars. Gifts made to the church for a specific purpose must be agreed upon beforehand by the Board of Trustees.

#### Appreciated Stock

By making a gift of stock you receive an income tax deduction and eliminate the capital gains tax.

#### Charitable Remainder Trust

You can use under-performing appreciated assets to create steady income for the rest of your life. You receive a significant charitable deduction and the capital gains tax is eliminated. Your trust can be professionally managed.

Note: Undesignated Bequests are, by policy, split 10% for mission projects with the remainder split 50/50 between the Church's Investment Account, with growth and interest only being used, and the Capital Reserve Fund, used for capital improvements and ministry opportunities. Recently, monies from the Peck bequest were used for 2 cameras for virtual worship and for incidentals for the new generator.

Our Church is a member of this Association of 16 local UCC congregations and clergy in southern Litchfield County. They meet as a large gathering of delegates each May and October in one of the churches for a meal and a program of interest to the churches. The Church and Ministry Committee meets on a monthly basis and is in charge of oversight of clergy and congregations particular around ethics as well as the shepherding of those who wish to become ordained clergy.
