# An Update about the Church Bridge, Parking lot and rear walkway

The Trustees have been awaiting the completion of the plan and survey being conducted by the NRCS (Natural Resources Conservation Service)

Prudently, we can not repair the Church Parking Lot and adjacent walkways until the bridge is replaced. While the bridge design and engineering are completed, thanks to Brian Neff, we have to wait for the receipt and acceptance of the final plan by the town officials. NRCS will potentially cover a majority of the cost of remediation of the flooding in the brook.

The plan will set the new height of the sides of the brook and we can then plan for the bridge height. We have been patient and will continue to do so along with our neighbors.

As a temporary solution, Chris Steers has loaned us 2 aluminum staging planks to allow us to walk over to the other side of the brook. Be mindful that this is temporary, is not intended for heavy weight, and does not have side hand holds. Use with caution.




