# Mission Matters

## **Daily Bread Food Pantry**

Daily Bread prefers the following list of items they need and want, and items that they have ready access to, so don't need as donations.

YES - items needed/wanted are: cereal (hot and cold), pasta and pasta sauce, canned veggies, soup, common spices and condiments, coffee (instant and ground) flour, Hamburger Helper, cake mixes and frosting, rice (white) and dried beans.

Items that are very popular and selected immediately are: vegetable oil, sugar (white), laundry detergent, and dishwashing detergent. Other popular non-food items are: toothpaste, tooth brushes, hand soap, shampoo, and feminine hygiene products.

NO - Items NOT needed/wanted are: mac & cheese, boxed milk, meat, canned tuna, peanut butter, butter, eggs and stuffing mix.

The food pantry gets items from the CT Food Bank (weekly delivery) that are on the NO list, so it is best to donate items that are on the YES list.

In addition to the items mentioned above, clients receive frozen meat, milk, eggs, and fresh produce each time they visit. Currently three visits per month are allowed, although no-one is turned away without food if they are in need.

On another note, the client distribution days are Tuesday and Friday, 9:30 - 11:00. About 30 people are needed on client distribution days. There is an in-place crew for distribution days, which is held outside. If you'd like to help, there is always the odd job that needs doing.

Donation days are Tuesday, 11:30 - 1:30 and Wednesday, 2:00 - 4:00. If you would like to be a receiver of donations at the Food Pantry, contact Daily Bread's Volunteer Coordinator Karen Pricken (kchristine24@gmail.com). If you would like to help, send Karen an email and tell her what days you are available. She will get back to you with what slots/days are open.

Our church has been wonderful at donating, so keep donating - it goes to help those that may be food insecure.



# To Ensure the Word Gets Out...



Our Church Operating budget depends in small part to Invested Fund interest Income as well as capital projects around the Church.

#### Gifts through your will

The Roxbury Congregational Church can be named as a beneficiary in your will and you can specify an outright gift of cash, securities, real estate of tangible personal property. If your estate is subject to the federal estate tax, a charitable bequest can save significant tax dollars.

#### Appreciated Stock

By making a gift of stock you receive an income tax deduction and eliminate the capital gains tax.

#### Charitable Remainder Trust

You can use under-performing appreciated assets to create steady income for the rest of your life. You

receive a significant charitable deduction and the capital gains tax is eliminated. Your trust can be professionally managed.

#### Charitable Lead Trusts

A charitable lead trust can enhance your ability to make larger current gifts to the Roxbury Congregation Church and you can preserve assets for your family while still supporting the church. You can also reduce your taxable income and your estate tax.

#### Gifts of Life Insurance.

This can be done either by purchasing a new life insurance policy or by contributing a policy which you currently own, but no longer need. Roxbury Congregational Church can be designated as the beneficiary of the policy, while you retain the right to change the beneficiary at a later date and otherwise retain ownership of the policy.

#### **Benefits**

- Tax advantages are substantial, especially on appreciated securities and properties.
- Total income, estate and capital gains tax savings and the probate expenses savings can come close the amount transferred.
- Many giving options can assure you of income for the rest of your life.
- Your assets remain in your control during your lifetime.

- While unrestricted gifts allow the church to allocate funds to areas of greatest needs, we can also help you direct your giving to the areas where you have the greatest passions.
